PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

InTraRegio has carried out a series of **transnational workshops** to support the international learning process among the project regions. Five transnational workshops have been organised, one in each project region, attended by regional innovation programme makers, scientific actors and industrial transport players. Next to local participants, also stakeholders from the respective other project regions participated to the workshops in order to generate a real information flow and knowledge exchange:

• The Forth Transnational Workshop of InTraRegio on "IT Systems for Transportation and Logistics", has been organised by the University of Calabria, R&D.LOG and the Gioia Tauro Port Authority on the 09 and 10 July 2014 in Campora San Giovanni, Italy. The transnational workshop focused on "how ICT could be exploited to support the establishment of efficient and effective transport systems".



• The Fifth Transnational Workshop of InTraRegio on "Port and Sea Terminal" took place at the Technology Park of Fuerteventura, Spain, on 19 November 2014, organised by the Canary Cluster of Transport and Logistics (CCTL). The workshop has been organised in the framework of the 'Atlantic Logistic and Transport Exhibition' (SALT 2014) that took place in Fuerteventura in the period of 19-21 November 2014.
